## Major achievements

### Achievement 1

In December 2021, I received Ph.D., from Zaporizhzhia National University (Ukraine), specialty 032 "History and archeology". The topic of my dissertation was "The Hoshkevych family in the socio-cultural life of Ukraine". In this work, I researched the history of the Hoshkevych priestly family, its transformation in the conditions of modernisation changes and the activity of individual representatives in various spheres of social and cultural life of Ukrainian society. The purpose of the research was to study the history of the Hoshkevych family as a social and cultural community, whose representatives were active participants in the religious, ecclesiastical, cultural, social and scientific life of Ukraine.

Scientific novelty of the work:

- it was made an attempt to reconstruct and comprehensively analyse for the first time the history of the Hoshkevych family as a social and cultural system;
- social and political changes, personal successes / failures of individual members of the family were defined as factors of transformation of social status and professional activity of Hoshkevych;
- a holistic view of the impact of family ties on the formation of cultural values and doctrines, professional ambitions of individual members of the genus was formed [4, 5, 6, 7];
- the polarisation of political orientations of the Hoshkevychs as a result of the crisis of the Russian Empire and the establishment of Soviet power was highlighted on definite examples [4];
- the Family Archive of the Leonid Hoshkevych Family was analysed and systematised for the first time, which is stored in the funds of the Kherson Regional Universal Scientific Library named after Oles Honchar [6];
- intellectual biographies of the funder of the Kherson Museum, and the editor of a private newspaper, Viktor Hoshkevych (1860—1928), and his daughter, the archaeologist Iryna Fabricius (1882—1966) were reconstructed for the first time [1, 2, 3, 5, 7];
- a number of little-known archival sources on Hoshkevychs' network connections were revealed, which allowed to inscribe the history of the family in the context of socio-cultural and social life of Ukraine in the 19th – ½ of the 20th centuries.

## Achievement 3

Since May 2022, I have been the senior FNS researcher (Scholars at Risk program) at the University of Lausanne. During this time, I prepared for publication the monograph "The Hoshkevychs: a new family history" [1] and two articles, which is due for publication in 2024. I am the author of the project Restore#UACulture [2], for which we have recorded 19 interviews with figures from the fields of education and culture in the south of Ukraine for distribution on international platforms. In March 2023, together with Professor Béla Kapossy, we organized the conference "Humanities in Ukraine: recent trends and challenges" at the University of Lausanne, the purpose of which was to gather potential scientific partners from the Ukrainian and Swiss sides for future joint projects. In total, about 50 scholars took part in the conference, 30 of whom were speakers. A great achievement was the section "Building Bridges: Panel Discussion on the Situation of Ukrainian Academic Institutions" (moderated by Prof. Béla Kapossy).

On February 26, 2024, I organized the conference "10 years of occupation of Crimea: realities and consequences" at the University of Lausanne to discuss the problem of the destruction of cultural and archaeological heritage in Crimea together with Ukrainian and Swiss experts.

On March 13, 2024, I organized the workshop "Ukrainian Studies in Lausanne", where we presented monographs devoted to Ukrainian studies published in Switzerland during 2023 and held two round table discussions. I also presented my monograph at this event.

I heads the representative office of the "Ukrainian Scientific Diaspora" network in Switzerland, the purpose of which is to unite the efforts of Ukrainian scholars from different waves of migration for the effective integration of Ukrainian scholarship into the international academic community.
